The /i/sound.


Short, **closed**, pure vowel.

Closed meaning that the tongue is high in the mouth.

The /I/ Sound

How to make it

The part of the tongue slightly nearer the **center** is raised to just above the half-close position (but not as high as in /i:/). The lips are spread **loosely**, and the tongue is more relaxed. The sides of the tongue may just touch the upper molars.


Closing meaning that glides towards /1/

The /aɪ/ Sound

How to make it

The glide begins in an open position, between front and centre, moving up and slightly forward towards /i/. The lips move from neutral, to loosely spread.


